## UNIVERSITY OF BARCELONA

### Faculty of Geography and History of the University of Barcelona



**Carrer de Montalegre, 6**, 08001, Barcelona, in the Raval neighbourhood, right in the city centre and just a few blocks from Plaça de Catalunya and Las Ramblas.

**All sessions will take place on the 2nd floor of the Faculty**, while the plenary sessions will be held on the 4th floor.



## LOCATION

There are several ways to reach the faculty by public transport:

- The **closest metro stop is Universitat** (at plaça de la Universitat), about 350m away (5 minutes on foot). It is served by metro lines L1 (red) and L2 (purple).
- Another nearby option is Plaça de Catalunya, 600m away (8 minutes on foot). It connects to metro lines L3 (green) and L1 (red), as well as the FGC commuter rail services: L6, L7, S1 and S2.

In addition, **numerous bus lines** operate in the surrounding area, offering further access to the faculty.

A **single journey costs 2,65€**, while a 10-journey ticket (the "T-Casual") costs 12,55€. When purchasing a transport card for the first time, you will need to pay an additional 1€ for the physical card, which you can then reload as needed.

Few recent developments in labour and employment have attracted as much attention as the expansion of the platform economy. Research has mainly focused on labour platforms intervening in male-dominated industries where formal, reg-

ulated employment is the norm, or where platforms are creating altogether new kinds of work. As labour platforms begin to mediate work in low-wage industries with workforces marked by centuries of economic exclusion based on gender, race, and ethnicity, we can speak of a process of feminisation of the platform economy. This talk discusses how platforms are restructuring work for different populations of workers and becoming crucial actors in the political economy of migration and social reproduction.
